Prescribing practices survey – win free conference registration!

The Society is conducting a <u>survey</u> of antiretroviral prescribing practices among nurses and doctors working in South Africa. Switching to the fixed dose combination (FDC)

The Department of Health is concerned that some facilities have delayed their rollout of the FDC Tenofovir/Emtricitabine and Efavirenz. The FDC should be offered to all eligible patients. It is easier for patient to take and easier to dispense, with less risk of errors. The FDC is also cheaper than the single drugs, and stocks of single drugs should be limited to those who need them for medical reasons. All priority groups should have begun switching, including all HIV positive patients eligible for initiating ART; HIV positive pregnant and breastfeeding women stable on 3TC, TDF and EFV; and virologically suppressed patients on a d4T-based regimen who have normal renal function and stable patients receiving singles of TDF, 3TC and EFV as clinically appropriate.
