Our *Gender Affirming Healthcare guidelines* have provided a critical platform through which quality healthcare provision to transgender and gender diverse populations can be realised. A call for skills development has led to the development of the *gender affirming healthcare training course* in collaboration with partners and stakeholders. 2023 will see the updating of our SAHCS *PEP guidelines* along with the publication of our first SAHCS *Syphilis guidelines*. New online courses will be developed in line with feedback from SAHCS members – thank you for telling us what you want!

The 6th *SAHCS Conference* will take place in person from 8th – 10th November 2023 and will provide the latest in evidence-based medicine to keep clinicians informed of new therapeutics on the horizon, new strategies for management, and sessions on improving skills. SAHCS is also hosting the 30th *International Workshop on HIV Drug Resistance and Treatment Strategies*, to be held from 20th – 22nd September 2023. We look forward to seeing you there!
