Statement on Efavirenz

The Society's Child and Adolescent committee has issued a statement on the use of Efavirenz (EFV) in children less than 3 years of age. The statement is in response to FDA's approval of an expanded indication for EFV to include children from 3 months of age and weighing at least 3.5kgs. The Society does not recommend the routine use of EFV in children under 3 years of age or less than 10kg due to toxicity and efficacy concerns. Managing HIV and TB resistance

We are pleased to include a copy of the 'HIV and TB Resistance & Clinical Management Case Book' along with the June issue of SAJHIVMED. Given the challenges of HIV and TB drug resistance confronting health care workers in Africa, the case book uses a case-based learning approach to provide information on how drug resistance develops in HIV and TB; provide in-depth information on interpreting resistance tests and the new diagnostic tests available; and how to offer comprehensive care for patients. Authored by Dr Theresa Rossouw (UP) and Drs Richard Lessels and Tulio de Oliveira (African Centre for Health and Population Studies), the book is published under an open access licence and a PDF can be downloaded here.



The June issue of the Southern African Journal of HIV Medicine is available <u>online</u> and in the post. This issue features updated guidelines for the prevention, diagnosis and management of cryptococcal meningitis among HIV-infected persons; original research including challenges to delivering quality care in a PMTCT programme, a suicide risk screening scale for HIV-infected persons in the immediate post-diagnosis period, and parental presence within households and the impact on ART; and case studies covering AIDS-related KS and pregnancy, when to retest in pregnancy and progressive HIV infection in the presence of a raised CD4+ count.

This issue also includes our first "clinical challenge", a regular section where we present complex, realworld HIV medicine cases to two experienced clinicians working in very different environments, and ask them to describe the approach that they would take if they saw the case in their local hospital setting. In our first edition, a patient with deteriorating liver function is presented by Prof. Francois Venter and Dr Ntsakisi Masingi, and then discussed by Dr Sarah Stacey in Johannesburg and Dr Sarah Fidler in London.

The June issue of HIV Nursing Matters will be released at the 6th SA AIDS Conference. This issue is focussed on family and community-centred care.

Fixed-dose combination (FDC) letter to private practitioners

In late April the Society sent a <u>letter to private</u> <u>practitioners outlining the phased roll-out of FDCs</u> <u>in the public sector</u>. Presently, only patients who meet the following criteria are eligible for FDCs in the public sector:

Priority 1: All HIV positive patients newly initiating ART (adults, adolescents and pregnant women, regardless of CD4 count) who do not have contraindications to the FDC component drugs; and

Priority 2: HIV-positive pregnant women and breastfeeding mothers currently stable on lamivudine (3TC), tenofovir (TDF) and efavirenz (EFV).

If you are approached by public sector patients who **do not** fall into priority 1 or 2 for FDCs, it is critical that they patient understand that if they are switched to the FDC in the private sector and then return to the public sector for healthcare it may not be possible for them to remain on the FDC. We appeal to you to help manage the expectations of patients and the priorities of public healthcare facilities during this transition period. Guidelines

The latest Society guidelines, guidelines for the prevention, diagnosis and management of cryptococcal meningitis among HIV-infected persons, were the first Society guidelines that underwent a "consultation period" prior to finalisation. During the consultation period members were able to submit comments on the guideline; we received many substantial comments that resulted in changes to the final document. Thank you to those who took the time to read the guideline and provide feedback. All future Society guidelines will include a similar consultation period. The next guideline to be published will be on mental health; we will send a notice to the membership when the document is ready for review. Other guidelines in the queue include an update to the Society's guidelines on antiretroviral therapy management for displaced populations (published in 2007) and post-exposure prophylaxis guidelines (published in 2008).
